Always put food waste in the green biobags. When we have harvested the food waste for biogas, the residue will be used on the farmers' fields as natural fertiliser.






Glass

Empty jars, glass containers and bottles - whole or broken. Lids and labels can be left on. We make sure these are discarded and recycled separately.






Metal

Metal waste is valuable and easy to recycle - but must not contain electronics, oil or hazardous waste






Cardboard & Paper

Cardboard and paper both go in the container. If it is clean and dry it can be recycled.





Residual Waste

Your residual waste is the leftover waste from your recycling. It is incinerated for the production of electricity and heat.





Textile Waste

Do you have worn and outlived clothes and textiles? You can recycle them as long as they are clean and dry.





Hazardous Waste

Sort and recycle your hazardous waste to avoid harming people, nature or the environment. This also includes batteries and small electronics





Plastics and Food and Beverage Cartons

Plastic and food and beverage cartons go into the same container - they will be separated at the sorting plant.
